Are you a candidate for telemedicine?

Telemedicine uses a video-conferencing system called the Ontario Telemedicine Network (OTN) to connect people who are in two different places. For our cancer patients, this means providing cancer care as close to home for every person. Telemedicine is simply having your doctor's visit using video instead of in-person. You remain at a location in your city or town, usually at your local hospital, and your
