Sexual Health, Intimacy and Cancer (SHIC) Clinic

What is the SHIC Clinic?

The Sexual Health, Intimacy & Cancer (SHIC) Clinic is part of the Simcoe Muskoka Regional Cancer Program. Your sexual health is an important part of your overall health. Often cancer affects sexual health; the purpose of the Clinic is to address and support your sexual health concerns. The Clinic is for **any patient or partner** who has questions or concerns about their sexuality.

Why is this Clinic for me?

Cancer and its treatments may bring emotional and physical changes. This Clinic is for patients and/or their partners having difficulty adjusting to these changes; specifically focusing on how treatment is affecting their sexuality.

How do I get an appointment?

There are three ways to get an appointment:

- Ask someone on your Care Team to refer you
- Call 705-728-9090 ext 43520 for an appointment
- Visit the Patient and Family Support desk located on the second floor of the Cancer Centre (next to bloodwork area)

A 2-way conversation. We will work with you to develop a personal care plan to support your sexual health needs.

A team approach. We can refer you to other healthcare professionals, if you need it.

Private and confidential. Rest easy knowing that the discussion stays within your Care Team.
