Exhibit celebrates 117 years of RVH's rich history

Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre (RVH) celebrates its roots with a historic exhibition entitled 'Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre: Foundations of a Community.'

This exhibition is a collaborative project between RVH's History Committee and students from the Museum & Gallery Studies program at Georgian College. The exhibit celebrates the early days of RVH and commemorates RVH's rich history in the community and surrounding region.

The Georgian College students created the exhibit of RVH history in collaboration with members of the RVH History Committee, Simcoe County Archives and Simcoe County Museum. The exhibit features artifacts from the Simcoe County Archives, a vintage microscope on loan from Brenda Kraft of the RVH Core Laboratory, and images scanned from original nurse graduation photos circa 1907 to 1929 from RVH's historical archive.

The exhibition will be on display until June 21, 2014.
