Helpful tips

Keep your receipts and a travel log.



Receipts such as parking and medical supplies, and the kilometres travelled for medical appointments, may be helpful to you when you're filing your taxes. Talk to a social worker for more info. Call 705-728-9090 x43520 for an appointment.

Buy a multi-use parking pass.



Most hospitals have a multi-use parking pass that can save you money if you'll be visiting often. At the Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre, there are parking passes that allow you to have unlimited in and out access, ranging from 24 hours, 1 week, 1 month, or longer. Consider Canadian Cancer Society's Wheels of Hope transportation service.

What other resources are available?

Simcoe Muskoka Regional Cancer Centre Compassionate Fund: Provided limited financial support for cancer patients experiencing a financial emergency. Referral to the cancer care social worker is required for financial assessment and completion of application for assistance. Call 705-728-9090 x43520 to make an appointment with a social worker.

Speak to a Drug and Special Access Navigator: If you are having difficulties paying for your cancer-related prescription drugs, the Drug and Special Access Navigator can help you with private insurance for prescription drugs, government and patient assistance programs. Call 705-728-9090 x43373 to make an appointment.

Trillium Drug Program: The program will assist patients with the cost of medications covered under the Ontario Drug Benefit program. For more information, search "[Trillium Drug Program](#)" in your web browser, or contact the SMRCP Drug and Special Access Navigator at 705-728-9090 x43373.
