- be having or had cancer treatment at a hospital or cancer centre in the last 12 months from the date of registration.
- be able to get in and out of the vehicle by yourself, or with help from an escort/caregiver.
- ask your Cancer Care Team to refer you.

Please book your ride at least 3 days in advance.

CT Link is a web-based program to help you find a ride to your COVID-19 vaccine

appointment and medical appointments. CT Link is partnership with many other regional ride programs (some mentioned below) and acts as a one-stop shop to help you find a ride.

To register for the service, you must be:

- An older adult or senior, adults with physical or cognitive disabilities, and adults with mental illness
- Living in Simcoe County
- Needing help with travelling
- Having trouble using public transportation
- Not eligible to use other assisted transportation programs

The Canadian Red Cross Transportation program provides transportation services for those in need, such as elderly or individuals with mobility issues in the community. Services most communities in the Simcoe Muskoka region except for Orillia and Huntsville. Please call to confirm service area.

To register for the service, you must be age 65 or older or age 19 and older with mobility issues. Patients are required to pay for the service based on the fee schedule. The fee schedule is based on distance. It is about \$12.00 for round trip within Barrie, up to \$200 round trip if travelling more than 200 km.

Please book your ride 7-10 business days in advance.
