

How to find the General Hematology Clinic:

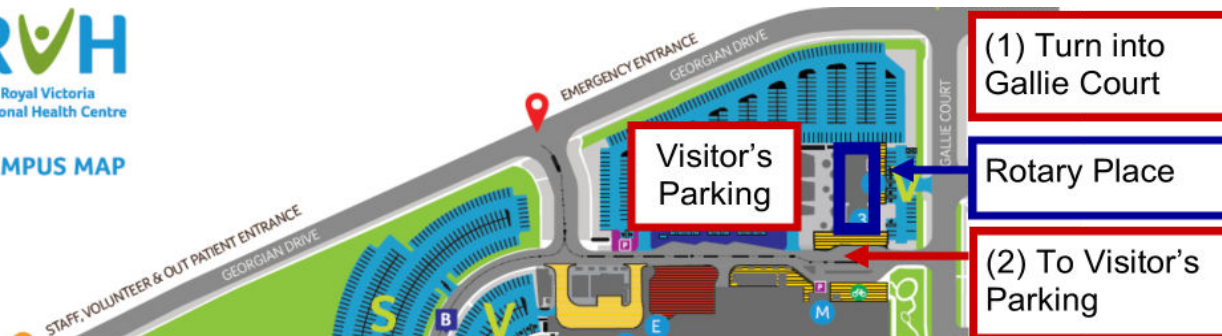
The General Hematology Clinic is located on the 2nd floor of the Rotary Place Building on the Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre Campus. The Rotary Place building is located directly across from the Main Entrance/Cancer Centre Entrance at RVH. Entrance and parking are accessible from the east side of the property closest to Tim Hortons.

From Highway 400 North: Exit Duckworth Street and continue straight through the lights onto Georgian Drive.

From Highway 400 South: Exit at Duckworth and turn left on Duckworth St. and left again at the lights onto Georgian Drive.

From Georgian Drive: Proceed along Georgian Drive past the main hospital entrance, turn right onto Gallie Court (#1 below) (Tim Hortons is at the corner), Rotary Place is on your immediate right on Gallie Court. Park in the visitor parking lot #2 below).

Locating the General Hematology Clinic: After entering the Rotary Place building, take the elevator to Level 2. The clinic is located in the "Rotary House Lodge".

What is the General Hematology Clinic?

The General Hematology clinic is a clinic where patients with blood disorders can be supported, followed and treated by a specialized team. The clinic will coordinate testing, care, and referrals needed to follow-up on the needs of the patients in the clinic.

Why have I been referred?

You have been referred to the general hematology clinic because your doctor feels that a blood specialist would be best suited to review your current situation. The general hematology team will meet with you and arrange any necessary tests and next appointments.

What happens next?

1. Once the clinic receives the referral, the initial appointment information and date is sent to your referring physician.
2. You will receive a phone call from the program's clinic clerk, who will:
 - Provide you with the date and time of your appointment and/or any tests that need to be done before the appointment.
3. Attend your scheduled general hematology appointment with the physician and specialized nurse.

If you are feeling too unwell to come to your appointment please call to let us know and we can reschedule.

During your general hematology clinic appointment, you will:

- Be referred for tests and procedures to find out more information if needed.

- Ontario Health Card
- List of current medications, vitamins, doses and herbal supplements
- List of your allergies
- Any questions or concerns you have
- A family member/friend to help you process the information
